Oxleas Woodlands Pathway Project - Funding

In addition to the improvements that will be funded by Greenwich Park and Open Spaces Department, we have submitted two bids to the Greenwich Neighbourhood Growth Fund community funding scheme. The bids cover the replacement of two sleeper bridges in Jack Wood, which are reaching the end of their life and the replacement of an associated flight of dilapidated steps. If our bids are selected, they will go to a public vote along with all other bids made so we will let you know when this happens and seek your support. As we've previously reported, making good all the paths in Jack Wood to prevent further habitat destruction, is a large undertaking and we will be exploring other options for funding and fundraising.

Shepherd Leas Development

We've received confirmation from Meridian Home Start that they've put in an appeal following the refusal by members of the Planning Board in July. While they await this decision they have been working on a new planning application due to be submitted this month. The main change will be a reduction in two storeys on the highest element, decreasing the height from 30 meters to 24 meters. We will respond when we see the planning application.

Habitat Conservation

Whilst we are cutting back holly and removing some of the vergeside undergrowth we're also preserving habitats by leaving stumps in the ground and building log pyramids.

Pathway Improvement

Since mid-April 2022, the Woodland Conservation Group has concentrated on pathway improvement - amassing 562 volunteer hours to date on the Lower Path, northern part of Stoney Alley and, latterly, the eastern end of middle path. The objective is to remove holly and scrub within 3-4 metres of the paths which allows the drying effect of sunshine and air circulation. Additionally, acting on advice from Butterfly Conservation, we intend to actively manage the verges encouraging a wider diversity of flora. In turn, this will encourage pollinators and invertebrates, thus improving biodiversity.





Size Does Matter

You may have forgotten how wide the tarmac path is, leading southwest from Oxleas Café, then North to the council offices. Brambles on one side and turf on the other were heavily encroaching. Woodland Conservation Group Volunteers have restored it to its original width, allowing passage without further erosion of the grass verges and more of this is intended when the bird nesting season starts and our woodland activities are curtailed.
