We start by saying a huge Thank You to Tom Wareham for being an excellent and inspiring Chair to FOW. Some of you may already be aware that, for personal reasons, Tom has recently resigned his position.

Tom, a founding member since FOW's 2018 inception, steered our growth, fostering a community of over 600 members, active volunteers, and a network of supporters In Greenwich and beyond.

Under his guidance, we achieved significant milestones: restoring Castle Wood Rose Garden, identifying the ecological need for, and launching of, the Pathways Project, and installing Friends' and Interpretation Boards by Oxleas Café. Tom's efforts forged a credible partnership with Greenwich Council, and local woodland and green network advocates.

The Steering Group is very grateful to Tom for his commitment, hard work, and leadership. His passion for nature and woodlands has inspired many to understand the importance of respecting, protecting and enjoying Oxleas Woodlands. The good news is that Tom will continue to volunteer and to lead his popular Houses in the Woods Walks.

Laurie Baker, who leads the Shooters Hill Woodland Working Party and has been a Steering Group member since its inception, becomes our interim Chair until the March AGM when a new Chair will be elected.

We also extend our thanks to Sue Reeve, another founding member. Sue decided earlier this year that she will not be standing for the Secretary and Membership Officer roles at the AGM in March. Her dedication has fuelled our growth, organized events, and kept the Steering Group on track. Sue also manages the Litter Picking Group, which she will continue to lead.



### **Pathways Project Update**

Thanks to £2,623 already raised through our crowdfunding appeal on Just Giving, plus donations made into our bank account, a new 40-metre section of path began last month. This new section will join two recently laid sections that were funded by Royal Borough of Greenwich.

Following on from this, work will begin on the renewal of two bridges, and the replacement of a dilapidated flight of steps, funded by our successful bid to the Greenwich Neighbourhood Growth Fund.

The Council are also funding some work in Oxleas Wood. Fencing will be erected around a badly eroded area of woodland to prevent further deterioration. Once the area has recovered, the fencing will be relocated to a different location.





## **New Tuesday Volunteering**

The Woodland Conservation Group has grown significantly since we started and, consequently, about 18-months ago, we added a second Friday group each month. The groups have continued to go from strength to strength and we are making significant inroads in managing the woodland. We are now trialling a third weekday session (Tuesdays) which will be led by Alan Jarrett. Together with the Saturday Conservation Group (SHWWP), we can now offer volunteers a weekly opportunity to get involved with woodland conservation. Initially, this group will concentrate on habitat improvement in Shepherdleas Wood, which is also ancient woodland and a SSSI. Our first trial group will take place on Tuesday, 24th October. ## How Are We Organised?
