Members' Meeting - 6th December 2023

Attendance at the meeting was smaller than usual with several people suffering or recovering from colds. Laurie gave Steering Group feedback on topics such as Health and Safety, the Pathways Project and exciting new walks planned for 2024. There was also a reminder about the election of the Chair and Secretary roles at the AGM on Tuesday 19th March 2024. The meeting approved the continuation of the voluntary donation scheme for 2024 .This was followed by an informative and entertaining talk by David Jones on the birds in winter.

Rose Gardens

Thanks to a donation from the Council's Parks department, we've been able to add a deep mulch of wood chippings to Castle Wood Rose Garden, topping last year's horse manure. We are now working on Jack Wood where we are weeding and then deterring regrowth with more chippings.



Woodland Conservation

We had a great turn-out for our second Tuesday session, and the moist ground was perfect for pulling up the brambles. A 'small' copse of holly, mid-slope took about 18 volunteer hours to clear!

Walkers now have an uninterrupted view across the slope between the two paths in this section. Look out for the amazing Parasol Mushroom, standing proudly above the autumn leaves.

Pathways Project

The new 40-metre section of path, funded by our Pathway Appeal, is now completed, and the renewal of two bridges and a flight of steps in the middle of Jack Wood, funded through a grant from Greenwich Neighbourhood Growth Fund, is nearing completion.

As required by the grant application to Greenwich, our Woodland Conservation Group volunteers have carried out habitat improvement in the vicinity of the works, completing over 200 volunteer hours removing holly, sycamore and cherry laurel. This has opened the woodland floor to more light and, in time, this should improve biodiversity.

Two further sections, linking the currently completed sections on the lower path in Jack Wood, have been commissioned. The first is a 140-metre section, jointly funded with Royal Borough of Greenwich. FOW will contribute £3,550 to the £14,000 cost. A further section of 50-metre will be funded by FOW at a cost of £5,000. These will be carried out in the New Year.

Altogether FOW will have funded 125m at a total cost of £12,550 - made up of £4,345 raised in the pathways appeal and £8,205 from reserves. Thanks again to all those who have donated. There are approximately a further 390-metres needed to reach Castlewood Meadow and complete the entire path, so please think of our wildlife and donate today.
