#### Can I ride a horse in the woods?

The Kings Troop of horses are a spectacular and somewhat unexpected sight in SE9 & SE18, and you might occasionally see them in the woodlands. However, there is only one bridlepath in Oxleas and it runs from opposite Woodlands Farm to the corner of Oxleas Meadow. This is the only place where it is

permitted for the public to ride horses. We ask that riders respect the SSSI status of the woods and do not damage paths by riding fast, nor introduce seeds and chemicals in faeces; please use a manure catcher.
