#### **News from the Gardens**

Volunteers have been working on the two formal flower gardens in Oxleas Woodlands since FOW started in 2018. Our greatest achievement was fundraising for, and replacing, all the roses in oneside of Castle Wood garden and encouraging the Council to install picnic benches on the other side. In 2023 we were still battling the legacy of Covid restrictions; the weeds in Jack Wood were stronger than ever. But as the year came to an end we finally had both gardens weed-free, and a layer of wood chippings to help keep them that way.



#### **News from the Woods**

During 2023 our woodland conservation volunteers were clearing the dry streams and building 'leaky' dams. It was hard to image the hard compacted clay soil ever needing water management measures but as you can see from the picture below, the very wet winter we are experiencing is thoroughly



testing our new defences.
Leaky Dams, barriers of natural deadwood, slow down the flow of the water. This reduces the amount of erosion and creates a variety of pools and streams for maximizing diverse environments.
